KEY RESPONSIBILITIES

Coaching

- Plan, deliver and review weekly coaching sessions in-line with the Club philosophy and coaching syllabus.
- Attend weekly matches and follow the Club's guidelines for confirming fixtures and referees.
- Be responsible for maintenance of training / match balls, bibs, cones and all other relevant equipment as required by, and provided by, the Club.

- Attend all in-service and coaching courses as directed by the Club, where possible.
- Recommend and recruit players for your team in conjunction with the Club, adhering to the Club's ethos at all times.
- Work closely with the Phase Lead Coach to organise player feedback to players and parents.
- Multi-disciplinary communication between other Coaches, players and parents to ensure the well-being and development of all players is at the heart of everything you do.
- Maintain honesty and integrity at all times when working with young players at the Club.
- Be presentable, smart and personable at all times when representing the Club.
- Undertake all reasonable tasks assigned by the Club and Phase Lead Coach.
